

District State of Address

It has been six months since Block House MUD board members and Crossroads Utility Services met and decided to change my role as Operations Manager of Block House MUD to full-time General Manager; I was working in a part-time role for seven months prior. Working with the current MUD Board of Directors, they have asked Crossroads and me to focus entirely on Block House. They found some room in the budget and voted, and I couldn't be happier!

My staff, which consists of **Amy Earls**, full-time Community Coordinator located at the Walker House, **Travis Grider**, full-time on-site parks personnel, and myself, have had a great time working in this beautiful district and have been welcomed by many people who have made Block House their home. Since becoming GM, we have completed many projects in the community in areas that required upgrades.

Now that the fiscal year has ended and a new one has begun, I'd like to share many of our challenges with residents, both met and soon to come. One of the benefits of living in a municipal utility district is the government is smaller than a city. It is much easier for residents to make a big difference in their quality of life. Through many volunteering opportunities, the people of Block House have stepped up, chipped in, and made the community better for all of us.

Ice Storm and Cleanup, Jan-Feb 2023

The brush dump and mulching, disc golf course cleanup, and rightof-way clearing were a great success after the storm. Between rolling power outages, pandemics, and ice storms, residents have proven they like to step up and help out during emergencies. Jumano Disc Golf Course

After the ice storm, professional disc golf course designers offered to consult on course cleanup for several thousand tax dollars. Instead of funding this expense, residents (disc golfers and non) organized cleanup days and cleared fallen limbs. In the coming year, we plan to replant many of the critical trees that had to be removed and plant new trees that will become evening shade for all tee boxes exposed to the sun. Additionally, we are looking to tackle the erosion problem by routing Jumano water runoff and building footbridges where applicable. We've added boulders that will soon indicate tee information instead of all the metal poles that no longer contained the initial signs installed.

Walker House Renovations and Infestation

This was no small task of adding new paint, new boardroom tables, mini-blinds, new video screens, or upgrading electrical panels and AT&T fiber to help broadcast all board meetings live. We found the undercarriage of the house to be home to rodents from the nearby creek. The number of dead carcasses found required a complete environmental remediation to help with air quality inside the structure. A new skirting was added to the backside of the newly installed porch to help curtail future rodents from making this area their living space.

Tumlinson and Apache Pools

Electricity issues for both pools were identified, with repairs completed at Apache and soon to be completed at Tumlinson; chemicals

have been addressed with the new pool contractor Premier Recreations and ProAquatics. We ended last year's swim season and will enter this swim season with full lifeguard staffing. Renovations continue at the guard shack for Tumlinson, and you'll see more beautification on the slides, as well as a working splash pad and waterfall. New pumps are on order and set to be installed to keep the water flowing. DigDug completed decking repairs at Apache, and Priority Landscape added new turf to both pools. The board has approved a new pool cover at Apache that should arrive soon. You'll also see new tables at Tumlinson Pool and freshly painted trash cans again to assist with the beautification.

Sports Courts

The Sports Courts have been renovated with all courts resurfaced by Hellas Construction, new ADA doors with working wheelchair accessibility at the skate court and tennis/pickleball courts (you read that right. We added pickleball with the sport's popularity; the board approved for four new nets installed). Sagamore Fence is completing repairs to the fencing around the basketball and tennis/pickleball courts. For residential accessibility to all sports courts and pools, we've added the key fob system *Brivo* to the district. We have eliminated the need to reissue pool access cards every year.

Community Garden

We've cleaned the gardens, added a few tables from refurbished material, and tidied up the storage area, along with repairs to the PRV.

Bike Track

Paint to the stands, helping beautify the area, and a new water fountain is now accessible.

Chance Field

The infield was renovated last August by Priority Landscapes, grading out and tilling the existing infield clay, installing additional infield clay and conditioner while mixing the old and new material for consistency, and installing new adjustable bases to accommodate different teams and age groups, as well as the purchase of a new machine to help maintain the infield. Also, our parks personnel have been painting around the area to keep up with the beautification.

Playscapes

Tumlinson Park, the location for the community's premier play-scape, has been removed due to safety issues found at inspection. With the help of our park steward, Travis, we've patched and prayed enough to keep it alive this past summer. The board and bond officials are working diligently to fund the replacement of the playscape as soon as funding and design are finalized. Apache Playscape, located near Apache Pool, and Tonkawa Playscapes in Tonkawa Park have all been inspected and brought up to code to meet all safety requirements.

Right of Way Fence

The fence repairs have begun; with \$100k budgeted for this fiscal year, the board has approved more than 2,247 LF completed. We would like to have more areas scheduled for future replacement and staining of those areas
