MUD Transparency

It is essential for Municipal Utility Districts to communicate with residents within the district. Communication starts from the start of the home-buying process through the life of the ownership. These efforts keep district residents both knowledgeable and regularly informed.

1. NOTICE TO PURCHASERS

Homebuyers receive and execute TWO notices informing them that the home they are purchasing is in a MUD. The 1st notice is given with the earnest money contract & the 2nd is given at closing. No other local government in Texas is required to give such notice.

2. WHAT'S IN THE NOTICE?

The notice contains the MUD's current or anticpated tax rate, voted bond authorization and total amount of bonds issued.

The Notice to Purchasers, required by law, ensures that every MUD resident purchases their home with full knowledge of the existence of the MUD, its taxes and bonds.



All of these requirements, combined with the MUD regulatory oversight by the TCEQ, laws regarding open meetings, public information, conflicts of interest, and financial reporting, create a highly accountable and effective neighborhood government.

At closing, documents outlining property taxes paid & owed on the home, which include MUD taxes, are given to the buyer.

The HUD-1 Settlment Statment clearly shows the proration of MUD property taxes between buyer & seller

4. FURTHER TRANSPARENCY

In addition to the information that all taxing units are required to post on the internet as mandated by the Property Tax Reform Act of 2019, districts are required to post on the Internet a host of information including, the names and contact information for the district, its directors and consultants, tax information, meeting agendas and minutes, and financial information.

Introduction to Tidal Waves



Tidal Waves is a non-profit summer league Swim Team. We are part of the Northwest Swim Circuit. We compete against other teams in the NWSC like Steiner Ranch, Georgetown, Round Rock, etc. Tidal Waves Swim Team was the Division 3 Divisional Champions during our 2023 season.

When do you all have to take applications to be on the team?

For Neighborhood residents, a swim test can be completed at Polar Bear Swim. We typically hold Polar Bear Swim on the last weekend in December. Getting your swim test completed at this time allows you to register with returning swimmers instead of waiting for new swimmer registration. Swim tests consist of swimming 25 yards unassisted. Stroke knowledge is not required.

How long does the season last?

The season is typically 10-11 weeks depending on the calendar, beginning in late April, ending in late June or early July.

How many swim meets?

All swim meets are held on Saturdays. All meets are typically about 6-7 hours starting in the early morning hours. Swimmers are required to have a parent volunteer at all meets they attend; a minimum of attendance at 3 meets is required.

What ages do you all cover?

Kids 4-17 are able to swim with Tidal Waves with a passed swim test. We like to hire our aged out swimmers as coaches, so there is still the possibility of being part of the team in a different capacity after age 17.

Where are practices held, and how long are they held?

Practices are held at Apache Pool in Block House. In April through the last day of school, practices are in the evening. In the Summer, practices switch to mornings. Practices are Monday through Friday ranging from 30 minutes for our younger swimmers to 1.5 hours for our oldest swimmers.
