Public Protection Classification Results for Cedar Park OPA

Message from Cedar Park Fire Chief Mallinger



The City was regraded by ISO and obtained an ISO Class 1 rating for the third time. Even more important to your residents, the City ETJ, or as ISO calls

it, OPA, was also graded an ISO Class 1. This is

an improvement as ISO graded the ETJ as a class 2 in 2015. The rating of 1/1x means that all residents that live within 5 miles of a fire station and 1000 ft. of a fire hydrant get this highest rating.

Each insurance agency lowers that rating if the two requirements are unmet.
